Business div. moves toward the future

Spring is in the air! My spirits are lifted welcoming the birds, the warm sun and new challenges and opportunities of 2018.

In the business division, initiatives are moving forward. To name a few:

- The 2019 budget and planning processes are underway. We anticipate approval of a budget that continues investment in the buried pipe network infrastructure and the treatment plant.
- The city of Saint Paul and SPRWS are implementing new voice over internet protocol (VOIP) digital phones. SPRWS will be using VOIP by January 1, 2019, and will no longer receive phone service from Ramsey County.
- The city is implementing a finance system upgrade. The go-live of the INFOR upgrade is planned for Jan. 1, 2019.
- An upgrade to our on-line water bill payment processor called *Infinity Link* is planned for 2018. The enhanced software offers customers the ability to register on-line, have payments auto drawn from a credit card or bank account, view past bills, and use any device: cell phone, tablet and/or computer to process a payment.
- We are partnering with city of Saint Paul public works to implement a field mobile/ data capture solution for processing work orders and service orders in the field. The solution will integrate with our shared CMMS system and SPRWS' CIS system.
