To Whom It May Concern:

I represent Scott Kramer, who owns the Dearing Mansion, which is located at 241 George Street West in Saint Paul.

The purpose of this letter is to appeal the decision of the Planning Commission, made on May 4, 2018, revoking Mr. Kramer's conditional use permit for a bed and breakfast at Dearing Mansion based on a party that he threw on New Year's Eve in 2017. I was retained by Mr. Kramer just one business day prior to the appeal deadline, which is today. Mr. Kramer's application for appeal and the appeal fee are enclosed.

There are important facts that Mr. Kramer would like the opportunity to present to the City Council—facts that were not known to the Planning Commission before making the decision to revoke Mr. Kramer's conditional use permit.

Fundamentally, the Planning Commission viewed Mr. Kramer's party as a commercial enterprise that was inextricably linked to his use of Dearing Mansion as a bed-and-breakfast and short-term rental. In fact, the New Year's party was neither of these things.

The 2017 New Year's party at Dearing Mansion was an event Mr. Kramer threw personally, for fun—and at a loss of income from his short-term bed and breakfast rental business.

Perhaps nothing speaks to this more than the fact that Mr. Kramer began throwing New Year's parties at Dearing Mansion the year after he purchased it. The first party was in 2006—eight years before Mr. Kramer applied for his conditional use permit. And again, it must be underscored that for each of these occasions—including the 2017 party—Mr. did not make money, he lost money.

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Each of these parties was thrown by Mr. Kramer in his personal capacity as a home owner—the fact that some of these parties were held at the same time that Mr. Kramer operated a bed and breakfast should not automatically shift them from private party to commercial enterprise, as the Planning Commission appears to have done with its decision to revoke the permit.

Rather than a commercial endeavor intended to make the most money possible, this is something Mr. Kramer—an avid dancer—does for fun. He invited his friends and fellow dancers and their friends, and the cover charge was intended to cover the expenses, not to turn a profit. There is other information and a number of other documents that I would like to bring to the Council's attention, but as I have just recently been retained by Mr. Kramer, I will limit it now to the attached invitations to Mr. Kramer's previous parties.

Mr. Kramer recognizes that he has had past violations to the CUP, but would ask the Council for its understanding that at times it is difficult to separate what Mr. Kramer does at his home, personally, as opposed to how he operates his business.

Given the fact that Mr. Kramer shut down his bed and breakfast for four days over New Year's 2017—and did not take any short-term-rentals over a holiday during which he could have made several thousand dollars—there is no doubt in Mr. Kramer's mind that his traditional New Year's Eve party in 2017 was just that: The continuation of a tradition he had started in 2006.

The short-term-rental market continues to change in St. Paul, and it is Mr. Kramer's hope that the City Council can find a way forward that will allow Dearing Mansion. to continue to be a part of the bed and breakfast, short-term rental community in St. Paul




