
Criminal charges can be brought on the day the violation is observed, but generally we





This is where they would either store misc. stuff between the house and retaining wall.




This is the driveway for 778 Jenks, you may be able to tell it extends beyond the east retaining wall approximately 2'

With the disclosure form and driveway location, I am not sure it is my property they damaged.







Here you can see the piece of wood they nailed on wall as a step to climb the fence.




Another day when they let there pets just climb in and out of the window and rhome on the roof.




This is the window where the neighbors would run the laundry hose out the window and drain the washer all over the wall.




This is the middle of our properties the 2 x 4 nailed to the wall is where the neighbors use to climb
