Want to learn something new or brush up on some old skills?

SPRWS is again partnering with Century College to offer continuing education classes to utility employees this fall. Classes are available from now until the end of December.

Debbie Szulim sent out a complete list of available classes with times and dates in a email a few weeks ago. If you have not seen the list, contact Szulim for a complete list of offerings.

Courses cover a large gamut of topics from finance and accounting to management and leadership classes. You can learn better speaking skills and how to improve your Power Point presentations. You can sharpen your writing skills or learn to deal with conflict. And you can get some helpful insights into customer service.

Depending on the course, it may last four hours or a

whole day. The utility has two seats available in each of the classes it is offering. Some series courses, such as the Excel series, are sequential and must be taken in order. Others are stand alone. If textbooks are required for the course, they will be provided.

Classes are offered on a first-come, first-served basis. You must obtain management approval prior to signing up for the course(s) you are interested in.

Most classes are held at the main Century College campus in White Bear Lake.

Board meeting held at McCarrons on Sept. 11

The Board of Water Commissioners held a public hearing on the proposed 2019 budget the water utility on Tuesday, Sept. 11.

As part of the overall budget, the proposal included a water rate increase of 9 cents a billing unit in 2019. The Board recommended that the budget be approved by the city council as part of the city's budget process. Final approval is anticipated at the December city council meeting.

There will be no other changes to the water service base fee or the water main replacement surcharge.

Average residential water use is 17 units of water per residential single-family household each quarter.

The rate increase will cost the average consumer \$1.53 more per quarter than last year or \$6.12 more per year for water use.

This is an increase of 2.1 percent for the average customer.

The budget also encompasses all of the planned expenditures for upcoming year.

The utility has a budget of \$77.4 million for the next year.
