C. F. No. 114428—By Milton Rosen— Whereas, there was heretofore pre-sented to the Council the petition of the Weyerhaeuser Timber Company, being the owner of all the property along the line of the alleys hereinafter de-scribed, praying for the vacation of the alleys in Warner's Prospect Park and J. B. Warren's Rearrangement, as shown in red on the blueprint attached to said petition, which said petition is duly verified as required by law, and sets forth the facts and reasons for

such vacation; and

Whereas, the Council deemed it expedient that the matter therein referred to should be proceeded with, and or-dered said petition and accompanying plat to be filed of record in the office of the City Clerk, and ordered said Clerk to give notice by publication in the official paper of said City in the manner and for the time required by law, that said petition and the subject matter thereof would be heard by the Coun-cil at a meeting thereof to be held in the Court House on the 5th day of April, 1989, at ten o'clock A. M., which said notice was duly published and given; therefore, be it

Resolved, that the above described alleys, as shown upon said blueprint, be and the same are hereby vacated and discontinued as public alleys, subject expressly to the following conditions and reservations, viz:

(1) All the conditions, reservations and provisions contained in Ordinance No. 3394, entitled "An ordinance regulating the procedure and prescribing the conditions for the vacation of public grounds, streets, alleys and high-ways in the City fo St. Paul," approved March 16, 1915.

The bond provided for in said (2) ordinance, to be filed by said petitioner, is hereby fixed at the sum of \$500.00.

(3) Said petitioner shall pay into the treasury of the City of St. Paul the sum of Fourteen Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1450.00), together with the costs of this vacation proceding.
