

Property Tax and Budget Process for Taxing Jurisdictions



Contact County Assessor's office if you have questions on estimated market value.

Jan- June City Council working sessions to identify priorities.

April-August Taxing Jurisdictions develop budget August-December City Council evaluates the budget and may make adjustments

Sept 30th Max levy is set

November proposed tax notice sent using maxium levy

Nov/Dec Truth and Taxation Meeting to hear property owners comments on budget and proposed tax statements

December Budget is adopted

General Fund Highlights

- □ \$2.75M in street, sidewalk, and bikeway investments
- □ \$1.4M in recreation programming and facilities
- □ \$333,000 to establish the Office of Financial Empowerment
- □ \$523,000 creation of Fire BLS unit to assist with lower priority medic calls
- □ \$900,000 expand Police investigative ranks, additional mental health officers



2019 Proposed Final Budget

- City Property Tax Levy 10.46%
- HRA Levy 9.5%
- Housing Investment Fully Funded
 - \$10 million housing trust fund
 - \$2 million ongoing investment
 - Total housing investment of \$71 million with existing city and federal resources
- Police Investigator Adjustment:
 - Adds 3 additional investigator promotions for a total of 9 promotions- (\$46,437)
 - Adds 9 sworn officers to backfill promotions of which at least 3 shall be mental health officers (\$239,433)
 - Found savings in one time and ongoing Police fleet (\$239,433)
