

ATTACHMENT - APPLICATION FOR APPEAL - 507 Hall Avenue, St. Paul, MN

All the work and deficiencies in the living areas of home has been completed:

- First floor bathroom scrapped, recoated with plaster, and painted.
- The soffits to enclose the tubes for the air conditioning system finished and painted,
- The door cut, framed, and finished to provide egress from a second floor bedroom to the common areas,
- The upgrade of the smoke detector system beyond code finished and now operational,
- The covers for the outlets and switches for the second floor installed.

In addition, while not on the deficiency list, the old cellulose insulation and knob and tube wiring encased in that insulation has been removed, new wiring and foam insulation installed to improve energy efficiency and significantly reduce the fire hazard.

The remaining work to be finished on the project is the installation of the air handler, air distribution tubes, connection to the shuts for the second and first floors, connecting of the wires by the electrician, and the placement of the compressor, all work that takes place in the attic or outside and does not impact the living areas of the home.

Projection for completion of the attic work – air handler, tubes, connection to the shuts - is March 15. Placement of the air compressor and testing of the system will not be possible until mid- to late-May due to the snow and colder temperatures in late winter and early fall.

Revocation of Fire Certificate of Occupancy and Order to Vacate

Dear Property Representative:

Your building was inspected on December 12th,2018 for the renewal of the Certificate of Occupancy. Since you have failed to comply with the applicable requirements, it has become necessary to revoke the Certificate of Occupancy in accordance with Section 40.06 of the Saint Paul Legislative Code. An inspection to verify the building has been vacated will be made on March 1, 2019 at 9:30 am.

The Saint Paul Legislative Code further provides that no building shall be occupied without a Certificate of Occupancy. Failure to immediately complete the following deficiency list or the building vacated may result in a criminal citation.

DEFICIENCY LIST

- Interior Throughout SPLC 40.06 the certificate of occupancy is being revoked due to long term non compliance. This process started in April of 2018 and has multiply inspections with little movement towards compliance, this building needs to be vacated by the end of the day of February 28th, 2019 and an inspection will be on March 1st, 2019 to verify the building has been vacated.
- 2. MSBC -Section 105.1 Permits Required. Any owner or authorized agent who intends to construct, enlarge, alter, repair, move, demolish, or change the occupancy of a building or structure, or to erect, install, enlarge, alter, repair, remove, convert or replace any electrical, gas, mechanical or plumbing system, the installation of which is regulated by this code, or to cause any such work to be done, shall first make application to the building official and obtain the required permit. Work being done requires a permit. Have the building, electrical and mechanical permits closed.

You have the right to appeal these orders to the Legislative Hearing Officer.
