*The re-carbonation chamber got a cleaning on April 17. Staff worked through the day to get the area cleaned out and make any necessary repairs. This year they had some help from a hired crew using a vactor truck to move the excess spent lime that accumulated in the chamber over the past year. The annual clean out must be completed in one day, as the plant must shut down during the clean out. 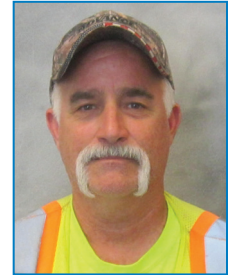
