Locally Preferred Alternative





- Dedicated guideway BRT.
- Phalen Boulevard and Robert Street into downtown Saint Paul.
- Ramsey County rail right-ofway (shared with Bruce Vento Trail).
- Highway 61 north of I-694 into White Bear Lake.
- Explore future connections to the north and other system improvements.

What is Bus Rapid Transit (BRT)?

High-quality service.


- Operates in own lane.
- Frequent and reliable.
- Upgraded stations and vehicles.
- Serves a different market than commuter express service.

BRT vehicles.

- Easy boarding at all doors.
- Electric / hybrid-electric.
- Quiet, low-emissions.
- Fare collection on platform.
- Bike storage.
- Right-sized for ridership.




Ongoing Public Engagement

 - Environmental impacts.
 - Health impacts.
 - Trail alignment and features.
 - Pedestrian safety.



Downtown Saint Paul Activities




- METRO Gold Line Shared Stations and Routing.

 - Some nearby residents expressed concerns about BRT station adjacent to Pedro Park.
 - 2 concepts developed for the southbound 10th Street platform – far side and near side.




10th Street Station Southbound Platform / Rush **Far Side Concept**

10th Street Station Engagement

- Public engagement activities have included:
 - Drop-in discussions (May 8 and 9).
 - Meetings with Metropolitan Center for Independent Living (May 8), the Penfield (May 24), the Alano Society (May 24) and Lunds & Byerlys (May 28).
- Next steps:
 - Recommendations from Saint Paul Issue Resolution Team and Technical Advisory Committee.
 - Present recommended location to Policy Advisory Committee in July.



Ramsey County Rail Right-of-Way Visioning Framework




Goal:

- Collaboratively developed through technical expertise and community input.
- Will be developed to help guide and support decision-making.
- Begins with targeted engagement activities.
