Your building was determined to be a registered vacant building on October 16, 2018. Since certificates are for the occupancy of buildings, it has become necessary to revoke the Certificate of Occupancy.

Saint Paul Legislative Code provides that no building shall be occupied without a Certificate of Occupancy. In order to re-occupy the building, the following deficiencies (if applicable) must be corrected and a complete Certificate of Occupancy inspection will be required.

DEFICIENCY LIST

Water cooler NEC 440.13 For cord-connected equipment such as: room air conditioners, household refrigerators and freezers, drinking water coolers, and beverage dispensers, a separable connector or an attachment plug and receptacle shall be permitted to serve as the disconnecting means. The appliance must plug directly into a permanent outlet. -
- 2. bedroom N E side MSFC 1030.1 Provide and maintain an approved escape window from each sleeping room or area, or discontinue use of area as a sleeping room. This work may require permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-8989. Remove all storage that will prevent emergency escape through window in case of emergency-
- 3. SPLC 39.02(c) Complete and sign the smoke detector affidavit and return it to this office.
- 4. MSFC 901.8.1 It shall be unlawful for any person to remove, tamper with or otherwise disturb smoke detectors-

- 5. MN Stat 299F.18 Immediately remove and discontinue excessive accumulation of combustible materials. -Remove charcoal and lighter fluid from house
- 6. MSFC 315.3.3 Remove combustible storage within 36 inches of fuel burning equipment. -
- 7. MSFC 603.5.3 Provide clearance around all mechanical equipment. -
