We, the undersigned residents of 300 Dayton Avenue, wish to state our objections to this and all requests for noise in excess of the allowed limits of 65 decibels (dBA) from 7:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. and 55 dBA from 10:00 p.m. until 7:00 a.m. at the receiving property.

These limits are in effect because this a residential area, and a densely populated one at that. Residents have work, school, sleep, family, and other obligations at all hours, and Saturday morning is no different.

We especially object to for-profit events being held in our neighborhood, requesting to make noise in excess of 30% over the allowed limit.

If Monster Series LLC cannot stay within the set noise limits in this residential neighborhood, then they clearly need to find a different venue for their event.
