We are appealing item number two on the deficiency list in order to request a variance or, alternatively, an extension of time to reduce the number of occupants. We are not appealing item one and item 3 and those issues are being dealt with by an electrician.

The house is located on Snelling Avenue across from the state fairgrounds and has five bedrooms and two full baths. Most of our renters have been veterinary students from the University of Minnesota, St. Paul campus. We generally find renters by word of mouth and I believe we have a great relationship with our renters. We bought the house when our son started vet school and hope the house provides an atmosphere that is supportive of the needs of our students to be successful in a very challenging curriculum. We occasionally have international students and we find them to be very respectful, polite, and thankful to have housing.

I received an email from one of the professors at the Vet school seeking a room for an international student. I entered into the rental arrangement and received a deposit from the student. I realize I should have known the limitations of numbers but it didn't occur to me at the time that it would be unacceptable to have five students in a five bedroom house. Normally we have had four or fewer renters. For most of last summer we had three renters and, as of now, this coming January we will be down to three again.

I have tried to find alternative housing for the student, without success. Housing for international students is very limited in availability because they need a furnished room which is close to campus since they don't have transportation. Also, they are usually here for just a few weeks and many landlords are looking for renters for longer periods of time.

I feel responsible for this student and want to do all I can to provide suitable housing and honor the agreement I made. I believe having a variance or an extension of time to reduce the number of renters is the best outcome. The renter is not at fault and I want to do everything I can to avoid hardship and to meet the renter's expectations.

We will absolutely abide by the limitation of 4 renters in the future.

 - -Hardwired smoke detector needs replacement. Replace with same power source.
