Councilmember Prince said she did not feel the proposed budget covered the basics and left needs in her ward unmet. She said she would be voting against it.

Councilmember Noecker thanked her colleagues for honest conversations even as they disagreed. She said she was pleased with both the outcome and the process leading to this budget.

Councilmember Thao said he would not be supporting the budget, although he felt it was a good budget overall. He said he didn't feel they should overburden the residents with taxes, and the funds from the sale of a parking lot for \$5 million were a missed opportunity to give the residents a break this year.

Council President Brendmoen said they had tried over the last couple of years to engage at the front end, so when the budget was presented to them it reflected the priorities and values of the Council. She thanked the Mayor and staff for working with the Council as they changed their process. She thanked her colleagues for all of the time devoted to the budget, and she acknowledged Council Budget Officer Holly Huston, and Office of Financial Services staff.

Councilmember Tolbert said much of the budget was for vital services being provided now and that would continue to be provided. He thanked Council President Brendmoen. He said putting together a budget with limited resources and balancing services people demanded and needed was very difficult, and Council President Brendmoen had done a great job of threading that needle.
