Project Description

Front 90 feet of driveway. Replacing existing cracked driveway, city sidewalk and apron.

- **Sidewalk**: replace same size, with same material and finish.
- <u>Apron</u>: replace same size, material and finish/color, will have 8" OC carriage lines. (see diagram). Also see other design options for consideration. Existing granite curbs will not be altered.
- <u>Driveway</u>: Remove concrete and replace with brick colored concrete. (See letter from Mike Dougherty, dated October 24, 2017, for additional technical information on concrete). The appearance, design, etc. of this driveway will be the same as the back portion that was installed on Friday, October 24, 2017. (See various photos of the actual finished back portion presented to HPC.)
- <u>Water management:</u> The general flow of surface water will be to the East, away from the house foundation. There will be a hidden drain tile system to transfer downspout water (3) to a drain field to the left (East) of the driveway. This will help assure continuation of an exceptionally dry basement. (There appears to be at least 8 feet of very sandy soil under the driveway.)

Why I Chose Stamped Concrete

When I first saw a stamped concrete driveway a few years ago I was stunned. It was a country estate with a very long (over 100 yards) and curved drive leading to a fake Victorian house. It was garish, overdone and had poor workmanship and lacked "taste." It did not interest me at all.

That was before I discovered Concrete Arts. I chose to work with them for the following reasons:

They are masters of their craft. After seeing examples (over 30 sample plots approximately 12" X 12") in their parking lot I knew I had discovered something with big potential.

I returned 3 or 4 times to their Hudson location to take photographs. These plots are 20 years old and have taken wear and tear in the parking lot. They look rather amazing. I submitted a number of photos of various types of design: stone, cobble stone, various brick designs to the HPC staff.

 The materials are time tested (I mentioned the 20 year old example in the Concrete Arts driveway. They showed no significant wear & tear, chipping & cracking, etc.

If the HPC thinks concrete is OK, remember this concrete meets the standards for highway/freeway construction (just not as thick). Concrete is supplied by Cemstone, sane as freeways.





- Strength

Same standard as for highway construction (4,500 psi compression strength, meeting ASTM standards.


I have specified steel rebars, 18 inch on center (see photographs of actual process used in my back driveway. Photos supplied to HPC.)

A major key to strength or durability is site preparation. I am blessed with at least 8 feet of nearly pure sand; it was, of course, power tamped.
