Instructions


Starting tomorrow night, remove the ace wraps when you go to sleep at nighttime, and then wear them during the day on your left and right arms where bruised and swollen for the next 5 days or until the swelling goes down.

Ice the areas frequently to make the swelling to go down.

Use the oxycodone only at nighttime for pain to help you sleep, otherwise use acetaminophen (follow the instructions on the bottle). You cannot drink alcohol if taking the medications.
