Appeal – Housing inspection order

Property: 956 Russell Street, St. Paul, MN 55016

Appeal 1: Code Deficiency/Violation - SPLC34.14(2)c – repair or replace the duplex convenience outlet with ground fault protection within 3 feet of the basin on adjacent wall in all bathrooms. This work may require a permit(s). Call DSI at (651) 266-898. The GFCI outlet in the kitchen has been changed by the owner and the tested is now reading that there is a hot/neutral reverse connection. The outlet did not trip when tested. Contact a licensed electrical contractor to evaluate and properly repair the GFCI outlet. This work may require a permit.

This house was built in 1919. Most electrical works and wiring are original with the exception of a few updates in the bathroom. We bought this house in March 2012 and all electricity have passed inspections in the past.

On May 15, 2020, inspector Franquiz inspected the property. He was ½ hour late and never provided an explanation for his tardiness. Unlike other inspectors, Franquiz used a GFCI Tester to test the kitchen GFCI and said nothing. Then he went to test the GFCI in the restroom on the 2nd floor. After testing he showed us that this one works properly because it tripped when he pressed the Tester. But the one downstairs does not trip so he wanted us to fix it. We don't see the reason why we have to fix it. We tried to explain that this house is old wiring and it passed many inspections in the past. But he ignored and insisted that we fixed or replaced the GFCI outlet. That's why we decided to buy a new GFCI outlet and replaced it according to his correction notice. In the rush to fix everything to meet the deadline, we mistakenly connected the hot wire and neutral wire to the "LINE" instead of the "LOAD". If he did not write that the GFCI outlet must be replaced or repaired, then we would not have replaced it. As of now, 7/22/20, this GFCI has been corrected. We do not see the point of having to call a licensed electrical contractor to get a permit and to come replace the outlet as stated in the citation. The 2nd reason to appeal this order is the fact that Franquiz doesn't understand that older homes like ours do not have ground wire. That's why his Tester doesn't trip. This is common knowledge and we've told him that but he ignored our explanation. He insisted that the GFCI doesn't work and need to be fixed or replaced.

<u>Appeal 2</u>: The St. Paul Legislative Code requires that no building be occupied without a Fire Certificate of Occupancy. The code also provides for the assessment of additional re-inspection fees.

6/16/20 - inspector Franquiz did not show up for his scheduled re-inspection. After we followed-up and complained, he wrote us an email on 6/17/20 to apologize and said that there will not be a fee for his no-show inspection (Email attached). This was an insult and very condescending. We responded to him that we expect future inspection to be free of charge because of his screw-up. We wasted 2 precious hours for this no-show inspection. We are working people who take personal time off just for this appointment. We are requesting the city to fully waive the re-inspection fee.
