It had not been my intention to appeal this order until a phone conversation with Inspector Richard Kedrowski on July 7. He was returning my earlier call of July 2 seeking clarification of the violation code "E unimproved surface" on the order. Since he then defined the violation as the need for a 4 foot setback from the property line and not the surface material itself, I decided to appeal. Before ending our call he indicated that he would not seek enforcement of the order while the appeal proceeded.

In approximately 2007 and 2013 the city had also issued abatement orders for this same area. In both of those cases it was a misunderstanding whether the parking area surface consisted of Grade 5 gravel as permitted by the code. In the last case, the need for some addition weeding was also ordered. I complied with both of those orders. In the last case I even went further than requested by the inspector, adding another ½ load of gravel and after weeding applying a coating of Roundup weed killer to the entire area.

Both inspectors approved my remedies but <u>I wish to emphasize that in neither order was a requirement for a 4 foot setback ever cited.</u>

The parking area in question was originally a portion of my back yard. With changes in my family, somewhere during the years 1997-1999, I determined that a couple of extra parking places next to my garage would be beneficial. Before proceeding I called the city inspection department. They told me to submit a simple drawing of the area noting dimensions, location of my garage, and the property line, which I did. The project would involve moving my fence south from the alley, digging up all the grass, and covering the proposed area with a gravel approved by the code. The city gave me approval for the project. I proceeded and an inspector came out and looked it over when I was done. The city stated no requirement for a 4 foot setback nor raised any objection to the finished product and I began parking there and have done so ever since. I sought city approval before I began because I would not have risked going to all that expense and labor only to have the city say afterward it was not permitted.

I have used this parking place for more than 20 years, gone through at least 3 previous inspections by city inspectors and never had this challenged until now. I will need the history of abatement orders and resolutions to present my appeal and have requested them but this may affect the date for my hearing.
