V. New Business

A. 1179 7th Street East – Historic Resource Review of a Category 3 Vacant Building (Boulware, 266-6715)

This property was referred to the HPC by the Legislative Hearing Office for Saint Paul. Owner is pursuing financing to restore and utilize the structure.

The owner has stated that their intent is not to demolish the structure.

Commissioner Lightner moved to write a letter that encourages the City Council to delay an order to demolish 1179-1181 Seventh Street East to fully explore and consider all options for rehabilitation and potential impact to the surrounding neighborhood. Commissioner Peroutka seconded the motion.

B. Green Conservation of Cultural Heritage Conference Proposal (Suhan)

Staff member Allison Suhan has been accepted to present a paper on sustainability initiatives and historic preservation in Saint Paul. Her paper compares the Saint Paul guidelines with the Secretary of the Interior's Guidelines on Sustainability and the Saint Paul's Climate Action Plan. The Conference is next month.
