ORDINANCES

An ordinance is a city law enacted by the City Council. It is read at four separate council meetings and becomes effective after passage by the Council and 30 days after publication in the Saint Paul Legal Ledger. Public hearings on ordinances are held at the third reading.

Councilmember Jalali made comments in support of the ordinance. She acknowledged City staff and community partners who played a role in the development of the ordinance. She spoke about the importance of the tenant protections in the ordinance especially in light of the current pandemic and the civil unrest.

Council members spoke in support. She expressed regret that they had not been able to get landlords, tenants and advocates together to hammer out equitable solution together, and said she was working towards creating the opportunity for that to happen going forward.

Councilmember Yang spoke in support, and said the work would continue and she looked forward to working alongside others to build towards a time when all people had a place to live dignified lives. She stressed the importance of all stakeholders working together on implementation.

Councilmember Noecker spoke in support. She emphasized the importance of housing as part of a just society. She acknowledged those who had opposed the ordinance, and said opposition and respectful debate led to the best decisions. She said most landlords were responsible and were trying to do what was right, and the ordinance was aimed at those who were not. She stressed the need for more work on broader housing issues.

Councilmember Thao spoke in support. He said small business owners and immigrant business owners just getting into the industry to be property owners had been listened to and heard. He thanked the activists and organization who had shared their concerns, and he said good policy should be about listening to all parties and coming to a resolution. He said the work to create more housing stock had to continue.

Councilmember Tolbert said tenant protections were part of the three Ps recommended by the Fair Housing Work Group along with production of affordable housing and preservation of naturally occurring affordable housing. He said the ordinance had a lot of good policy, but there were things that Council members had concern or disagreement about. He said he felt the ordinance as a whole would help people, and he would be supporting it, but he asked that everyone continue to be

open-minded and watch how the ordinance interacted in the market and the world to ensure the policies helped in the way intended and didn't do any harm. He said he felt that was the case with any ordinance. He asked that stakeholders continue to stay engaged.

Council President Brendmoen said the work was being passed to the implementation committee and she looked forward to hearing their observations. She said she was proud of the work that had been done and was excited to vote in support.

Councilmember Jalali moved final adoption of the ordinance.
