Who determines property taxes?


State Legislature- sets property tax policy, establishes property classes & rates, determines state aid, underfunded mandates to local governments, and levies state business tax

County Assessor – Determines market value and assigns property class

City – Determines levy amount



Why do property taxes change?





2021 Property Tax Environment

Overall estimated market values are up 8.6% from the prior year.

□ Significant property tax shifts continue among properties across the city.

Gain in Fiscal Disparity distribution based on State Formula.

□ Pay 2021 values were established as of 01/02/2020

Values post-Covid-19 remain strong with high demand/low supply




