I have also noticed more trash being in the streets, and at bus stops, and elsewhere within the City because we do not have additional pickup at our properties. My old hauler picked up things for very minimal cost at my property. Also in regards to the housing thing that was just passed with renting to criminals and people with low credit scores: as a landlord, I don't see anything but raising my rent to cover additional costs incurred with renting to less than desirable tenants. I have been doing this for 20 years and have had great tenants and people who take care of my properties. The only time I had a bad tenant is when I used Section 8 as a payment plan.
