2021 Proposed Capital Improvement Budget

- □ 2021 Proposed Capital Improvement Budget totals \$67.35M
- □ Major revenue sources include:
 - \$11M of Capital Improvement Bonds (CIB)
 - \$12.5M of Street Reconstruction Bonds (SRB)
 - \$11M of State Funding
 - \$9M of Federal Funding
 - \$8.7M of Municipal State Aid (MSA)
 - \$4M of Community Development Block Grants (CDBG)

CIB Redesign Update

- □ Second Year: Community Projects
 - Focused on Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED)
 - Received 100 community-submitted ideas via online platform
 - City staff held information sessions on CIB and CPTED
 - City staff identified 76 projects as potentially eligible for funding and invited proposers to submit full applications
 - CIB Committee reviewed and scored 40 applications
 - Scored on condition, usage, equity and inclusion, strategic investment, and adherence to CPTED principles
 - City staff provided cost estimates
 - CIB Committee heard presentations from applicants and held virtual public hearing
 - CIB Committee recommendations delivered to Mayor on September 30

| Lighting on Charles and Arundel | Improve lighting on Charles from Mackubin to Western and Arundel from Thomas to University (scaled from \$200k) | 100,000 |
| Lyton Park | Replace broken panels, repaint fence, install 2 park signs, add water service and pedestrian ramps | 99,287 |
| Lighting on Winnipeg and Rice | Replace existing fixtures with lantern lighting | 55,000 |
| Payne Avenue Skateboard Park | Design money for community skateboard park on Payne (scaled from \$536k) | 32,000 |
| Speed Humps on Charles | Install speed humps from Rice to Marion | 20,000 |
| Lighting on Hazelwood | Replace existing lighting from Maryland to Ivy with 100w equivalent LED | 17,500 |
| Lighting on Charles and Rice | Re-lamp existing lighting between Rice and Marion with 100w equivalent LED | 15,000 |
