I mailed in five money orders (see attached picture) for a total of $\$ 2413.00$ to pay off all assessments for the following 15 properties (each property has two assessment amounts). I placed in the envelope the assessment stubs and all the money orders together so you know which properties to apply the payments to. I never heard from you, but my tenants showed me the money orders that you returned to her. I was surprised and I am grateful that she was honest to give back these money orders.
