Kristin Guild, Interim Executive Director, acknowledged the program development work by the City staff team and business partners. Ms. Guild presented the program description, changes made since the program was introduced a week ago, acknowledged funding partners, gave a fundraising status update, provided rationale for the program criteria, the program administration approach, outreach plan, application support and timing, and provided a review of other resources available to businesses, residents and non-profits.

Commissioner Noecker asked for clarification on the allocated business and family funds and whether there is a single point of contact for constituents. Ms. Guild confirmed that Bridge funds are from 2020 budged business assistance and Housing Trust Fund dollars and shared the PED business assistance main phone number and business/family Bridge Fund email addresses.

Commissioner Prince asked for clarification if the family funds will be given to the family or the landlord and if housing development work will continue. Kayla Schuchman, PED Housing Director, shared that the funds will be disbursed directly to the families and that housing development work will move forward.

Chair Tolbert introduced an amendment to include language from the Board Report regarding the Business Assistance fund allocation.
