Recommended License Conditions: (conditions on current license with underline new strike-thru remove)

- ~~1. Per City of Saint Paul Legislative Code 409.15(a)(2), On-sale wine license shall mean a license authorizing the sale of wine not exceeding fourteen (14) percent alcohol by volume, for consumption on the licensed premises only in conjunction with the sale and service of food (menu item only). The sale of Malt (Strong) will also take place only in conjunction with the sale and service of food.~~
- ~~2. Per City of Saint Paul Legislative Code 409.15(e), licensee must be able to show that gross receipts are at least sixty (60) percent attributable to the sale of food.~~
- ~~3. Licensee will submit to the Department of Safety and Inspections (DSI) annual gross receipts for food and liquor for each year the license is renewed.~~
1. Licensee agrees to operate the establishment in compliance with Section 409.02 of the City of Saint Paul Legislative Code as a "Restaurant".
- ~~4.~~ 2. Licensee agrees to close the establishment at 12:00 a.m. midnight each day of the week. All patron/customers shall vacate the premises by 12:30 a.m. each day of the week as per City Zoning Code (parking requirement) and Section 409.02 of the City of Saint Paul Legislative Code.
- ~~5.~~ 3. Licensee agrees to limit the placement of table(s)/chair(s) on the public sidewalk outdoors to the area and number shown on the approved sidewalk outdoor seating plan on file with the Department of Safety and Inspections (DSI) and Public Works. Licensee shall take appropriate action to ensure table(s)/chair(s) are contained to this approved area.
- ~~6.~~ 4. Each year prior to the placement of table(s) and/or chair(s) in the public right-of-way (i.e., sidewalk), the licensee agrees to obtain a new Obstruction Permit from the Department of Public Works. Licensee agrees to maintain the sidewalk café in accordance with the conditions placed on an approved Obstruction Permit, acknowledges that an Obstruction Permit is effective on April 1 and expires on October 31 of each year, that table(s) and/or chair(s) may not be placed in the public right-of-way before or after the effective/expiration dates, and that a failure to comply with this condition will result in adverse action being taken against all of their licenses.
5. Licensee agrees to take appropriate action(s) to ensure that the sale, display, and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages is contained within the defined alcohol service area as per the approved plan on file with DSI.
- ~~7. No alcohol sales and/or service (e.g., wine/beer) is allowed in the public right of way (i.e., public sidewalk) without prior written approval and additional licensing from DSI.~~
8. 6. Any outdoor activities related to the outdoor seating areas on either public or private property shall comply with applicable State and Local rules and regulations, including but not limited to Chapter 293 Noise Regulations of the City of Saint Paul Legislative Code
- ~~9.~~ 7. Outdoor liquor service area (patio) will close at 10:00 P.M. on Sunday thru Thursday and 12:00 midnight on Friday and Saturday.

- Hour limits on outdoor service were from previous Legislative Hearing and can carry-forward.
- Did not apply for Sunday service and it appears closed on Sunday. Is this reduced hours due to COVID or **is he always going to be closed on Sunday?** Adding Sunday at a later date would require a 2nd public notice. Applicant should be advised of this.
