I am writing to encourage you to vote against repeal of the S.A.F.E. Housing Ordinance. For the reasons in the attached memos, I believe the best course for the city is to

- Table the vote on repealing the S.A.F.E. Housing Ordinance based on the rationale that the Federal Eighth Circuit Court of Appeals will be addressing legal issues that are highly relevant to the constitutionality of the ordinance, especially the tenant screening portion of the ordinance.
- Seek a stay of litigation in front of Federal District Court Judge Magnuson pending the Eighth Circuit ruling in Minneapolis case.
- In the event that the Eighth Circuit decision is adverse on the issue of tenant screening, prepare a revised ordinance that omits the tenant screening portion but retains the three other portions as part of a future "repeal and replace" strategy.
