Hydrant hysteria, pipe tapping teams forming now for fall

Teams are forming right now for two competitions held at the Minnesota Section AWWA conference in mid-September.

Hydrant hysteria requires teams of two and a coach to put together a hydrant the fastest, competing against other water utility crews from across the state.

Pipe tapping requires a team of five, including three participants, an alternate, and a coach. The team must tap a pipe and attach a water line to it faster than the other teams. Winners of both events get a berth in the regional competitions.
