Dear Legislative Hearing Officer of the City Council,

In July 2020, UPDC submitted a statement on recommendations for re-development and treatment of tenants at the 1484 UNIVERSITY AVE W site. We reiterate those (see attached) and add the following:

- The length of time that has elapsed with no progress on the site is very disappointing and damaging to the community and businesses at large.
- The City Council and HRA approved a demolition and development agreement in June 2020, however no progress has been made since then.
- It is not neighborly to leave property in disrepair in such a prominent location. It is a blight that stymies other developments, lowers the values of surrounding properties, scares away customers from nearby businesses, and leaves a clear message to the local small business community that they are not welcome or appreciated.
- Many other properties in the area damaged at the same time have already been repaired.
- Many new developments near Midway Center have been forging ahead 9 apartment buildings on Marshall Avenue alone.
- The tenants, many of whom were our neighbors and employers of our community, were evicted early with early termination of their leases.
- Low-income and non-car owning customers of those businesses have lost access to affordable retail and easy access to and from public transit.
- The site is the subject of many government sponsored incentives: Federal Opportunity Zone tax breaks, TIF eligibility, \$20 million in infrastructure funding
- It hurt our neighborhood small businesses and customers and continues to hurt our neighborhood.
- We fear our locally owned, entrepreneurial, affordable businesses will be replaced and displaced by new retail national chain tenants that can afford the rent and will further capitalize on the location.
