Dick, acting in their individual capacities as St. Paul police officers, Mark Ficcadenti and Mark Ernster, acting in their individual and official capacities as supervisors,, John Does 1-2, acting in their individual and official capacities as supervisory St. Paul police officer, Thomas E. Smith, acting in his individual capacity as the Chief of Police, and the City of St. Paul*, and be it
