WHEREAS, PBI is prepared to pay for hotel, registration, and lodging for Como Zoo and Conservatory staff to attend the training and participate by facilitating sessions on polar bear husbandry, training, and enrichment at an estimated cost of \$1700; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that participation in the training will be a valuable opportunity for staff and the zoo to increase their knowledge of polar bear husbandry; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Saint Paul City Council hereby accepts the funding for the Como Park Zoo and Conservatory Zoo staff to attend the PBI Climate Alliance 2018 and thanks PBI for its generous gift.
