Accepting the 2010 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) and amending the 2010 current financing and spending in the Police Department in the amount of \$30,000.

WHEREAS, the City of Saint Paul, Police Department has been awarded the 2010 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant; and

WHEREAS, this grant provides funds to support all components of the criminal justice system, from multi-jurisdictional drug and gang task forces to crime prevention and domestic violence programs, courts, corrections, treatment and justice information sharing initiatives; and

WHEREAS, the City of Saint Paul, serving as the fiscal agent for this award, will share the grant funds with two disparate jurisdictions within Ramsey County; and

WHEREAS, each jurisdictions allocation will be used for activities and projects that will provide meaningful and measurable outcomes consistent with the goals of the grant;

WHEREAS, a 2010 financing and spending plan needs to be established for these funds; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor pursuant to Section 10.07.1 of the Charter of the City of Saint Paul, does certify that there are available for appropriation funds of \$30,000 in excess of those estimated in the 2010 budget; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor recommends that the following addition be made to the 2010 budget; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that council accepts this grant and authorizes the City of Saint Paul to enter into, and Chief Thomas Smith to implement the attached agreement with the U.S. Department of Justice; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Saint Paul City Council approves these changes to the 2010 budget.
