Ratifying the assessments for Excessive Use of Inspection or Abatement services billed during July 24 to August 21, 2023. (File No. J2405E, Assessment No. 248304)

WHEREAS, the Saint Paul City Council in Council File RES 23-1700 accepted the Report of Completion for Excessive Use of Inspection or Abatement Service for Property Code Violations billed during the time period of July 24 to August 21, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the City Council's Legislative Hearing Officer has considered objections of affected property owners and developed recommendations for the City Council with respect to their assessments; and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a public hearing on March 27, 2024 to consider ratification of the assessment roll; and

WHEREAS, the City Council considered and found satisfactory the assessment of benefits, costs and expenses for the services provided; now, therefore be it
