WHEREAS, the Department of Emergency Management applied for and received a grant of \$73,218.75 from the State of Minnesota for the 2016 Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant to develop and write the required Hazard Mitigation plan, and

WHEREAS, the grant includes a match of \$24,406.25 which will be met with Emergency Management employees salaries, and

WHEREAS, the financing and spending plans have not been established for the grant received; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 10.07.1 of the Charter of the City of Saint Paul, does certify that there are available for appropriation funds of \$72,218.75 in excess of those estimated in the 2017 budget; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor recommends the following additional changes be made to the 2017 budget:
