WHEREAS, Law Day, held annually on May 1, is a national day set aside to celebrate the rule of law. Law Day provides an opportunity to understand how law and the legal process protect our liberty, strive to achieve justice, and contribute to the freedoms that all Americans share; and

WHEREAS, the theme of this year's Law Day was "Free Speech, Free Press, Free Society", ideals on which our democratic government is founded and which remain extraordinarily relevant; and
