WHEREAS, the Saint Paul City Council in Council File RES 22-761 accepted the Report of Completion for Excessive Use of Inspection or Abatement Service for the Property Code Violations billed during the time period January 20 to February 18, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the City Council's Legislative Hearing Officer has considered objections of affected property owners and developed recommendations for the City Council with respect to their assessments; and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a public hearing on August 17, 2022 to consider ratification of the assessment roll; and
