Amending Chapter 246 of the Legislative Code to allow the possession or consumption of nonintoxicating malt liquor, strong beer or wine purchased and consumed during a block party, festival or community event, within the Creative Enterprise Zone Entertainment District.

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAINT PAUL DOES ORDAIN:

SECTION 1

WHEREAS, the Creative Enterprise Zone (the "Zone") was created in the Raymond-University area of the City of Saint Paul to advance creative, economic and cultural development, and

WHEREAS, the Zone's vision is to be a livable, mixed-use neighborhood, recognized and sustained as a center of enterprise and creativity; and

WHEREAS, an increasing number of people make a living through their creative capacities, enhancing productivity and innovation; and

WHEREAS, the Zone will become an even more desirable place to live and work because of a vibrant mix of people and ideas; and

WHEREAS, defining the Zone as an Entertainment District will allow for even greater neighborhood vibrancy and street level activity that supports local artists and organizations; and now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Saint Paul does ordain:

SECTION 2

Saint Paul Legislative Code section 246.03 (c) is hereby amended to read as follows:

(c) The prohibitions of section 246.01 shall not apply to or prohibit the possession or consumption of nonintoxicating malt liquor, strong beer or wine purchased and consumed during a block party, festival or community event which has been duly licensed under Chapter 366 of the Legislative Code, when such possession or consumption occurs on a street which has been blocked off for the block party, festival or community event in the downtown business district, ~~or downtown entertainment district~~ or the Creative Enterprise Zone Entertainment District and the nonintoxicating malt liquor, strong beer or wine is purchased from a duly licensed vendor.

SECTION 3

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days following its passage, approval and publication.
