**Stated Reason for Appeal (if given)**: I purchased this property June 20, 2022. This bill is not mine as the seller still owned this property during its delinquent payments.

**Staff Comments**: Hauler records show that service was provided for one 64-gal cart during Q2 2022. The reason that the invoiced amount was less than the base cost of a 64-gal cart was due to a credit being applied to the account for a service hold during Quarter 1 2022 for one of the residential units. Since the current property owner is responsible for all currently pending assessments on the property, staff recommends approving the assessment.
