Approving the 2010-2011 Emergency Shelter Grant Fund recipients.

WHEREAS, on January 12, 1988, the Council of the City of Saint Paul approved the procedures to allocate the Emergency Shelter Grant (“ESG”) funds given to the City by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (“HUD”); and

WHEREAS, on September 1, 2010, the City of Saint Paul issued a Requests for Proposals for the ESG Year 2010-2011 which invited eligible nonprofit organizations to submit proposals to use ESG funds to serve Saint Paul homeless residents; and

WHEREAS, the 2010-2011 budget for ESG funds is \$350,982.00; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the approved procedures, the Emergency Shelter Grant Review Committee reviewed the ESG grant requests and recommended the following organizations for funding:
