Marcia Moermond, Legislative Hearing Officer: I am asking Council to grant two additional weeks for work to be done. Actually, I just realized the owner is here so I will let him make that ask.

The City issued orders on this a year ago. There was an order on the yard being a

mess, and there was also an order on vehicles being improperly parked. There was also an order on the shed. There are other problems related to the roof and the construction of the deck. A building permit was pulled for work, and the last inspection was in November 2024, so no progress since then. On screen are photos from August 20, 2024. Wood, trap, vehicles, and other things are all pictured. My recommendation to Council in August of last year, which was adopted, was that 1/3 of the work needed to be completed by November 1, 2024. The deadline for the next 1/3 was April 1, 2025. The final deadline was July 1, 2025, giving a total of 11 months. The first two deadlines were met, according to the inspector. This past Monday, though, on screen you can still see pallets, scrap wood, scrap metal, and vehicles improperly being there. The deadline addressing the vehicles was today, though you can extend it. The vehicles are almost all on unapproved surfaces. Some appear inoperable or are lacking tabs. The photos from Monday show that the last 1/3 is not taken care of, and I am asking that the City be allowed to execute a cleanup of the property.

Michael Corcoran: I didn't realize Moermond was going to give me two more weeks. I really did have a mess. I wanted to thank her and Lisa (Martin) for their good work. I ended up with a lot of building materials trying to learn how to do things myself. I'm peeling away at it and can't believe what I had, but it's hard.

Councilmember Kim: It sounds like you're amenable to Moermond's recommendation.
