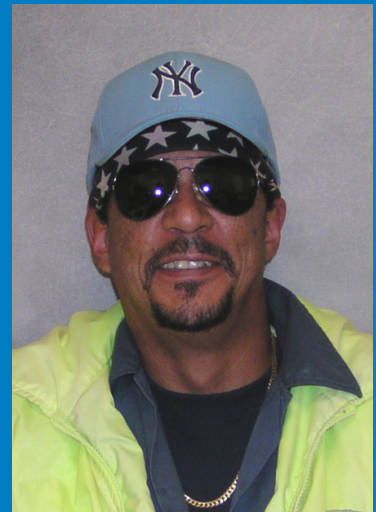

Register Replacement: Powering a Shift to AMI

Over the past few years, Saint Paul Regional Water Services has been steadily working to upgrade every water meter register across our system. If you're wondering, **what exactly is a water meter register?**—think of it like the odometer on a car. It displays the total amount of water used at a property. Many of our current registers are nearing the end of their expected lifespan, making now the ideal time to begin replacements.

These new registers come equipped with a remote transmitter that sends water usage data to a centralized collector. This work is a key part of our

larger Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) initiative—a major leap forward in modernizing our service delivery.

Together, the register replacement and AMI projects will bring significant benefits, including more accurate billing, faster leak detection, and the ability to identify unusual usage patterns much sooner. It's a win-win for SPRWS and our customers.

We've taken the time to carefully test installation methods and evaluate technology options to ensure we're making the best long-term choices. So

far, our team has successfully replaced 7,031 registers. Looking ahead, we're planning to replace around 10,000 more in 2025, and approximately 12,000 each year through 2031—totaling about 80,000 over the next six years.

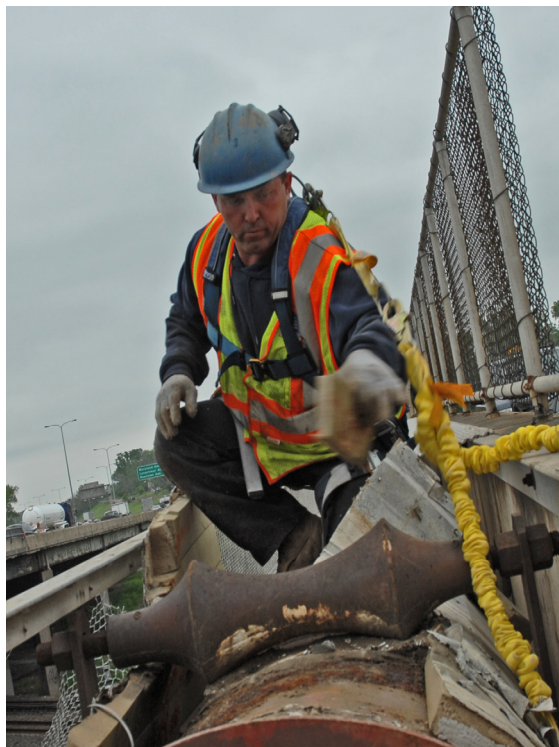

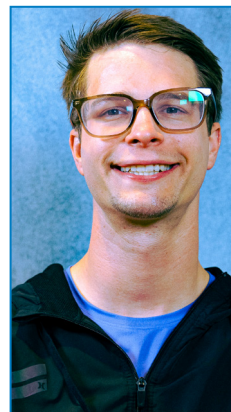

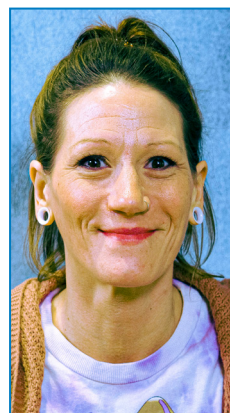
