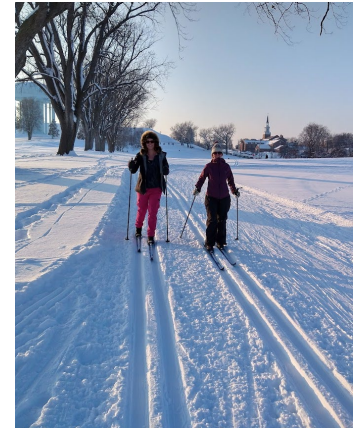






## 2023 Highlights

## 2023 Highlights

- Partnered with KABOOM! and the Saint Paul Parks Conservancy to end play space inequity over five years through a \$7.5 million joint fundraising effort

# Free Youth Sports

- Implemented Fall 2022, \$600,000 estimated for 2024 budget
- We're into our 5th sports season with this funding, all sports have seen increase in registration.
- Participation rates are up in most sports and age groups – girls' teams and older kids have seen dramatic improvements
- More teams = higher need for coaches, officials, etc. Volunteer rates have not followed participation trends, so we are relying more on city staff to be assigned to lead teams, and more games have gone un-officiated than pre-covid.
- We are working with students from Humphrey's School of Public Affairs program on an evaluation tool to use to help us better evaluate the program. The goal is to be able to make a case to our funding community and local businesses about the positive impact free sports has on young people and our community and to increase support.

# Free Youth Swim Lessons (Pilot)

- Implemented pilot for swim 2023 season including \$10K GF from Council in partnership with \$94,910 via a grant from the Met Council
- \$250,000 included for consideration in proposed 2024 budget
- Issued 700 scholarships to youth to eliminate fee barrier to participation





## Vegetation Management

*\$469,684 - 2023 budget*

- We manage approximately 2,300 acres of natural area across the park system. We need to retain, ideally increase, this level of funding if we ever hope to catch up on deferred maintenance and to meet maintenance commitments on grant-funded projects.
- Future plans: Use data collected with the project tracking system to inform and direct vegetation management activities for 2024 and beyond. Continue to expand the list of deferred maintenance sites for inclusion into the tracking system. Create regular maintenance cycles for all land management activities.





# Vegetation Management (contd).

### 2023 accomplishments

- Created 722 GIS records of land management activities within natural areas on parkland.
- Surveyed 51 of 54 raingardens on parkland.
- Completed deferred maintenance activities in 32 raingardens, seven of which will be enhanced with pollinator-friendly plants in Fall 2023.
- Repaired 1.5 miles of gravel and unimproved trails in three parks.
- Regularly mown seven miles of grassland and woodland trail systems within six nature-based parks.
- Completed almost exactly 100 acres of land management activities to include prescribed burning, mechanical removal of invasive species, and herbicide application of noxious and prohibited plants.
- Recorded over 468 individual locations for ongoing and future invasives species management.



## Community First Public Safety

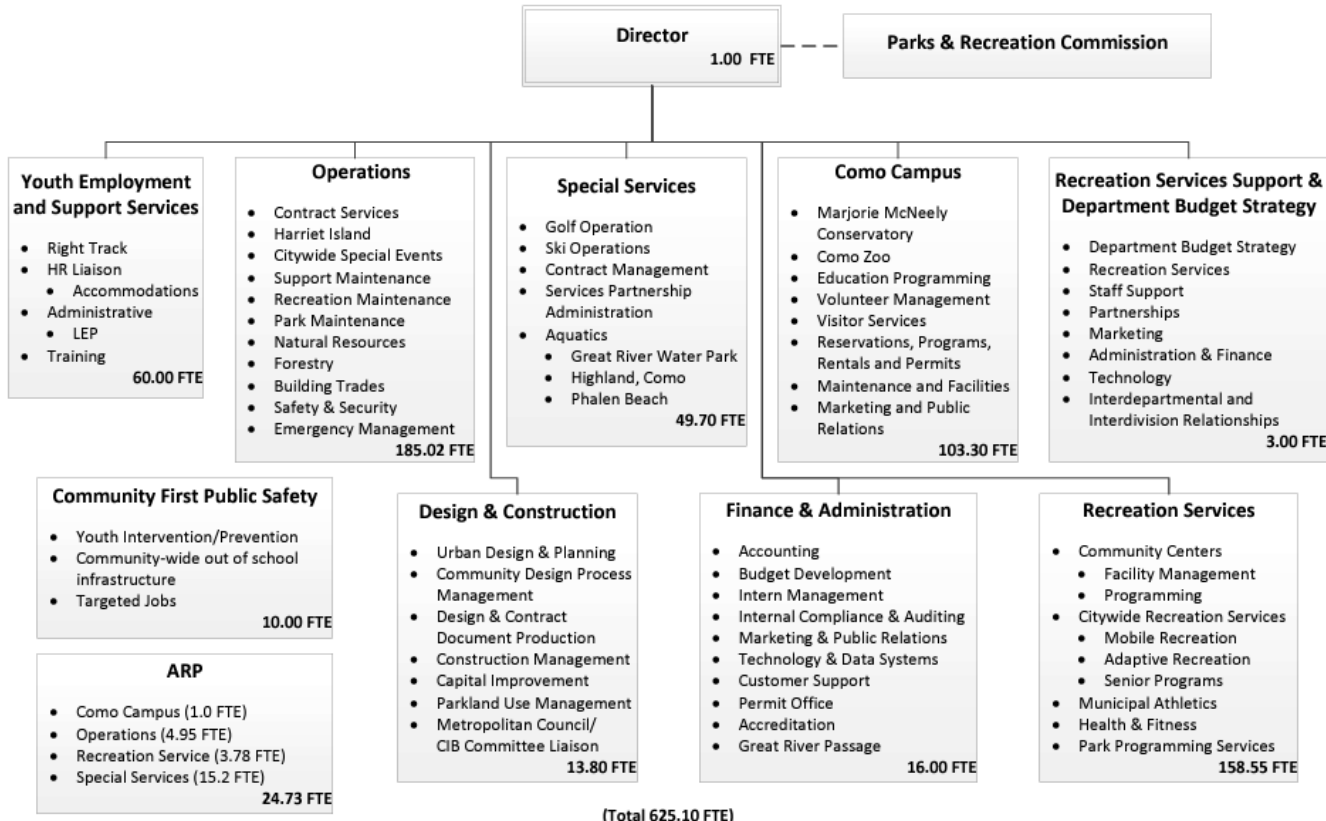
*\$90K (one-time) in 2023 for Vans,*

- Funding has provided a dedicated transportation resource for connecting youth with recreational opportunities throughout the City and beyond
- Program participants have had increased opportunities to experience things outside of their immediate geographic area
- **Since June 2023:**
  - 12 field trips
  - 10 Day trips
  - 28 youth per field trip average
  - 5 Households served

24.73 FTE included in this total are budgeted in General Government Account

## FTE Change Detail (2023 to 2024)

- 2.17 FTE for North End (NECC) opening in late 2024.

- 1.0 FTE increase for Highland Bridge (Ford) - New Forestry Arborist.

- 2.0 FTE increase for Golf (Park Services Lead and Park Services Assistant)

- 0.7 FTE increase for Como Grants Project Manager

- 5.0 FTE increase for Oxford

## Free Swim Lessons

\$250,000	General Fund	Ongoing	0 FTE
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- Free swim lessons for 2,500 youth ages 10 and under that includes a water safety education curriculum. This investment will continue to advance our work as a nationally recognized leader in drowning prevention and water safety education.
- The primary outcome measurement for the program will include targeted quantifiable numbers of underserved youth enrolled and completing a free swim lesson program.
- Data will also be collected and tracked to ensure this investment is spread out across our diverse city and is truly serving our young people who identify as BIPOC, low-income (50% AMI), have limited swimming proficiency, and recreate in and around bodies of water.
- An investment in free swimming lessons for Saint Paul youth ages 10 and under directly supports existing initiatives to provide economic justice, while also helping prevent child drowning deaths in Saint Paul.



## Como Veterinarian Care

\$80,000	General Fund	Ongoing	0 FTE
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- Como Park Zoo and Conservatory is a hub for free educational experiences and creating the next stewards of conservation by providing animal ambassadors. Having a healthy collection of animals, with animal welfare at the core, is important to continue this legacy. The animals need health care through a licensed veterinarian.
- Current veterinarian care is through a contract with the University of Minnesota and reflects a part-time primary vet.
- The proposal amount reflects the difference between the current University of Minnesota Veterinarian contract for primary vet care and internal support.



## Utility Increase

\$210,072	General Fund	Ongoing	0 FTE
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- \$1.3 million over budget in 2022, projected to be \$1.4 million over for 2023.
- Recent utility cost have increased by over of 40%.
- Parks and Recreation has over 80 buildings and although progress has been made to reduce utilities costs, there hasn't been an inflationary increase, prior to this, in almost a decade.
- Working to implement energy savings projects while also incrementally increasing budget to match actual usage





# Explore Operational Efficiencies in Partnership with Saint Paul Public Library

\$12,500	General Fund	One-time	0 FTE
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- **\$12,500 to support project to explore efficiencies towards total budget of \$50,000**
  - Parks and Libraries collaborate daily - programs for youth, operations of shared facilities, support for community members, and many others
  - Opportunity to further explore operational partnerships that may improve efficiencies or save costs for the city, including plowing of parking lots, garbage pick-up and many others
  - In addition to total GF investment of \$25K, parks and library will split remaining cost (\$12,500 ea).
  - **Responds to enterprise approach to working across departments to improve services by finding efficiencies and cost savings**



# Recreation Center Safety Improvements

\$675,000	Special Fund	Ongoing	TBD FTE
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- Parks and Recreation is currently undergoing a comprehensive audit of policies, practices, and resources pertaining to public safety, staff training and discipline, and systems of support in our Saint Paul recreation centers.
- The findings from this audit will determine strategies and funding priorities for this investment
- Known focuses will center on staff training and safety related security enhancements in all Parks and Rec locations
- This investment aligns with our goal of providing safe facilities and positive experiences for all who visit our shared public spaces

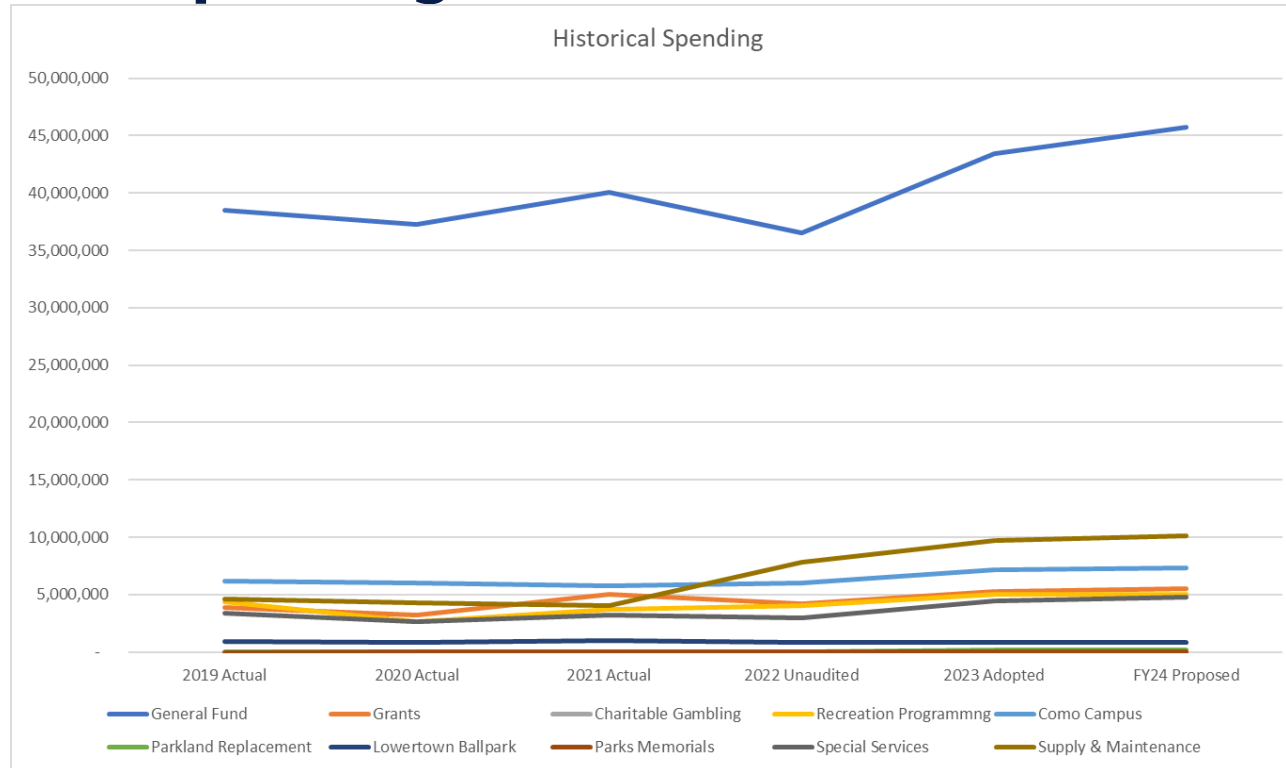
