- The Emergency Management Accreditation Program (EMAP) assessment
 - Peer evaluation of EM programs in compliance with 66 standards
 - Divided into 16 areas including; planning; resource management; training; exercises, evaluations, and corrective actions; communications and warning; and administration
 - Uses industry-recognized criteria to assess programs focusing on; mitigating, preparing, responding and recovering from disasters and emergencies
- Initial accreditation occurred April 2017 (5-year cycle)
- Re-Accreditation awarded January 2023
