2024 open enrollment information session set

It's time to start thinking about your benefits for next year. Employees should have received information on next year's benefits in an email in the last week.

To answer any questions you might have, an information session will be held on Thursday, Oct. 26 in the cafeteria in the administration building.

Field employees should come between 7:30 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. while office staff should plan to attend between 9:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.

Representatives from Medica, Delta Dental, Voya, MN Deferred Comp, BRI (flex account and VEBA health savings), Standard and Securian (life, short- and long-term disability insurance, long-term care insurance, etc.), and employee benefits staff (VEBA, Healthy Saint Paul) will be there.

Benefits sign up will begin on Monday, Oct. 16. Sign up must be completed online by midnight on Friday, Oct. 27 at https://benefits.stpaul.gov.

You will need your Employee Self Service (ESS) log in to sign in.

If you do not sign up, your current benefit elections will remain in place for 2024, with the exception of your flexible spending account.

Flexible spending accounts must be enrolled in every year.

It is helpful to bring a copy of your current benefits with you to the information session to make sure you get the answers you need for enrollment this year.

Candidates will work rotating 12 hour shifts, weekends, including holidays, 7-day work weeks, and opposing shifts or relief shift when needed.

The standard relief shift is 10 hour day shifts Monday through Wednesday, then Thursday covering second shift, when not covering other operator's shifts.

Candidates will be cross-trained in at least one other position for development within the facility and to provide relief duties as needed.

Requirements

Must possess a Class D Water Operators Certificate from the Minnesota Department of Health by start date.

AND must meet ONE of the following requirements:

Two years of experience as a water plant worker or equivalent experience OR

Completion of a post-secondary water or wastewater treatment program as specified by the department. OR

Two years of post-secondary education, which must include courses in mathematics or chemistry.

Note: Employees must possess and maintain a Special Boiler Operator License issued by the state of Minnesota within 3 months of their start date.
