4.A. Sentencing Guidelines Grid

Presumptive sentence lengths are in months. Italicized numbers within the grid denote the discretionary range within which a court may sentence without the sentence being deemed a departure. Offenders with stayed felony sentences may be subject to local confinement.




Historical Charging Rate







Intensive Youth Therapeutic Treatment Homes & Wrap-Around Services


- \$10M State Funding \$5 million for the homes and \$5 million for wrap-around services



Down 22% from highest









UNIVERSITY AVE. CORRIDOR CASES BY MONTH








University Ave. Corridor Case Charging Decisions & Outcomes




Our goal in providing this data is to increase transparency and accountability with our community. We recognize that achieving public safety and justice for all requires continual evaluation and improvement.


