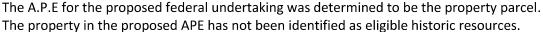

Description of the undertaking and Federal involvement:

The proposed federal undertaking consists of the demolition of the structure. No known acquisition or future development is anticipated.

Area of Potential Effects:

The APE was developed as per the definition in 36 CFR Chapter 8 Subpart C, Section 800.16(d), to include the "geographic area or areas within which an undertaking may directly or indirectly cause alterations in the character or use of historic properties if any such properties exist." The APE encompasses all reasonably foreseeable direct and indirect effects, including visual, auditory, atmospheric, and vibratory impacts.





The following conditions were assessed for the proposal:

The proposed undertaking is demolition of an modern intrusion which would not cause any potential impacts, and as a result, there would be no effect on the physical features or associative characteristics that qualify the adjacent historic properties for inclusion in the National Register.

Eligibility

Staff conducted a reasonable and good faith effort (36 CFR § 800.4(b)(1)) to identify historic properties by reviewing the available documentation on Saint Paul historic districts and individually listed local, state, and National Register sites, known, non-designated significant historic sites, project area parcel information, completed contexts and surveys, past planning, research, studies, general historical background material, and other previously inventoried properties.

Also, as part of the analysis, staff evaluated the integrity of this structure to convey any potential significance as defined by the National Park including location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, feeling, and association, and if the property retains the identity for which it is potentially significant.

This review was accomplished with sufficient documentation to enable any reviewing parties to understand its basis.

This is a modern commercial structure which is not an early nor distinct example of this type of structure, it is not known to be associated with persons significant or to have been the site of an important event. This property does not have distinctive characteristics of an architectural style, does not embody a specific time period, and does not serve as the highest or best example of a method of construction. The structure has had a series of alterations over the years. This building does not meet any of the NRHP Criterion for these reasons.

This is an unassuming residential neighborhood with commercial intrusions that was previously surveyed in 1983, 2011 and again in 2024. The area was found to have a simple architecture that had lost integrity and was not known to be associated with persons significant or to have been the site of an important event. The area does not meet any Criteria for eligibility for the National Register of Historic Places.

Disturbance

The Minnesota Field Archaeology Act (Minn. Stat. § 138.40) requires the City of Saint Paul to review any project involving ground disturbance on publicly owned property to determine whether known or scientifically predicted archaeological sites may be affected. Staff conduct initial research using the Minnesota Office of the State Archaeologist's Property Portal to identify known or potential archaeological resources.

The undertaking will not include any clearing, rough grading (cutting and/or filling), excavating, finish grading, or any related work, that reshapes the ground surface or otherwise results in the removal and/or destruction of natural vegetation and/or results in the ground surface being exposed.

Final Findings of Effect

A finding of "No Historic Properties Affected" under 36 CFR Part 800.4(d)(1) was determined for the proposed undertaking as the identification efforts discussed above identified no cultural resources/historic properties in the current APE.

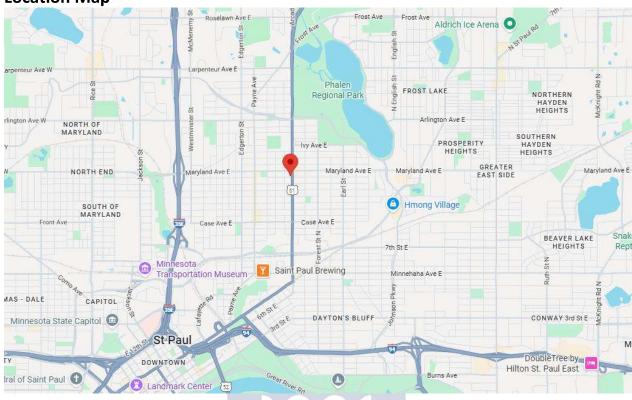
