I am a neighbor of Walker Wilkins, a neighborhood resident since 1979, who has walked my dog twice a day by his property since he has purchased the property. I have found Walker to be a pleasant and personable neighbor. Walker has been working on a project to build a stone wall on his property which borders his sidewalk for the past couple of years. This is a big project as he is working with large pieces of stone which include granite and bluestone. These pieces of stone require being cut and placed. The stone has been delivered to his yard and is dispersed in his front yard. Stone that was on the boulevard has been moved to his front yard. I find his project quite intriguing but difficult.
