I do not like the height limit of 36 inches for boulevard plants. I understand limits on intersections because of traffic visibility. But many of the plants that grow deep tap roots, which make effective rain gardens, are taller than 3 feet.

Rain gardens improve or bodies of water, and provide habit to insects. The monarch can't survive without the milkweed. And that grows over three feet tall.
