Revocation of Fire Certificate of Occupancy and Order to Vacate

Dear Property Representative:

Your building was inspected on October 13, 2023, for the renewal of the Certificate of Occupancy. Since you have failed to comply with the applicable requirements, it has become necessary to revoke the Certificate of Occupancy in accordance with Section 40.06 of the Saint Paul Legislative Code.

A reinspection will be made on October 31, 2023, at 03:00 pm or the property vacated.

The Saint Paul Legislative Code further provides that no building shall be occupied without a Certificate of Occupancy. Failure to immediately complete the following deficiency list or the building vacated may result in a criminal citation.

DEFICIENCY LIST

1. Throughout - SPLC 34.19 - Provide access to the inspector to all areas of the building. -Property is not owner occupied - **allow access to all areas of the property in order to perform Certificate of Occupancy inspection**
2. SPLC 39.02(c) - Complete and sign the smoke alarm affidavit and return it to this office.

3. SPLC 40.06(a)(3) - Suspension, revocation and denial - If it is found upon inspection of the fire code official that the building or occupancy is in violation of provisions of this or other applicable safety codes, ordinances, rules and regulations. -
Revocation is due to but not limited to unable to gain access to the property to perform the Certificate of Occupancy inspection. An inspection will take place to verify compliance on October 31, 2023 - failure to comply will require the property to be vacated at that time.

You have the right to appeal these orders to the Legislative Hearing Officer.
