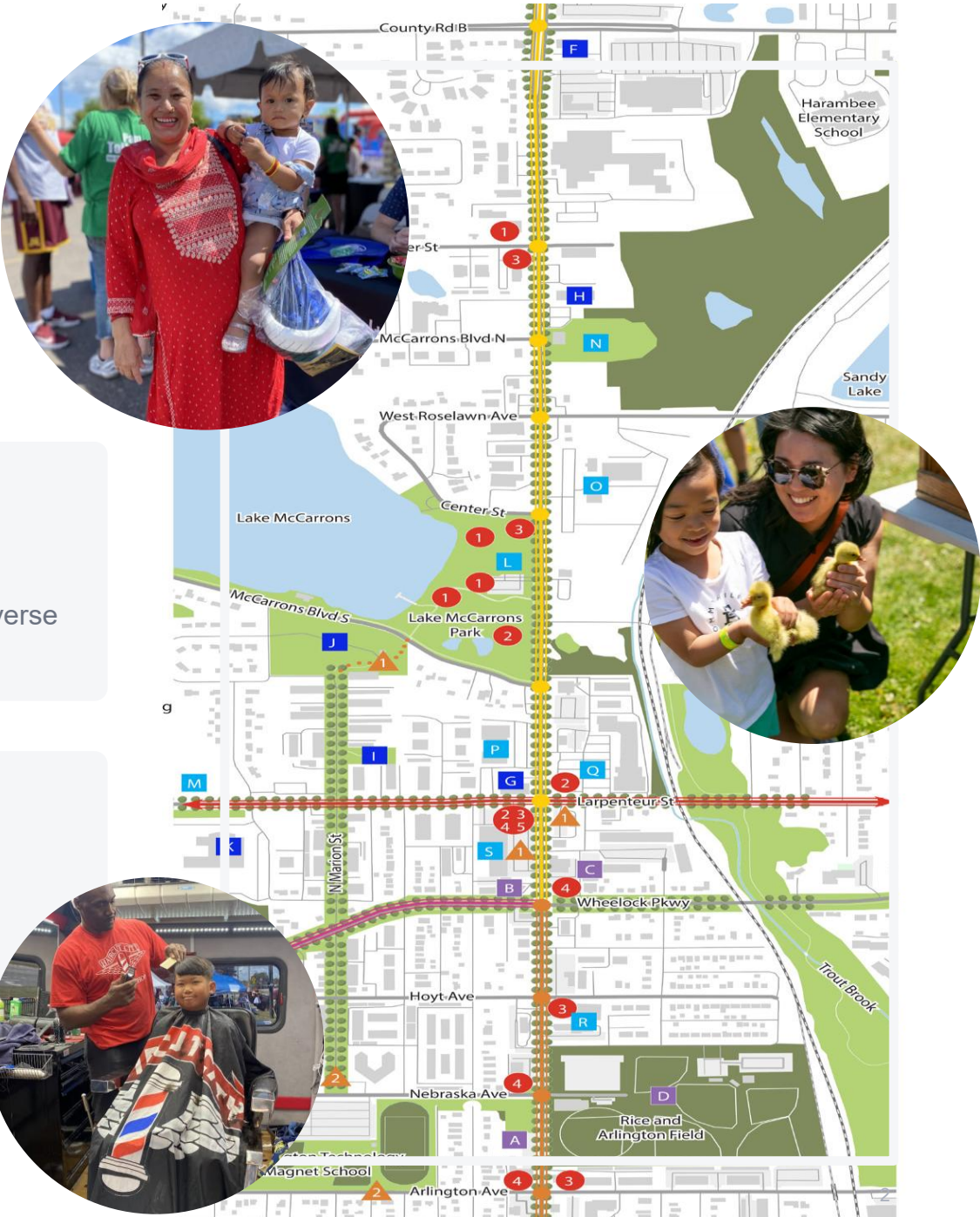

OUR SHARED VISION

The **Rice & Larpenteur Area** is a safe, engaging, and inviting **neighborhood center** that includes common spaces, a high-quality pedestrian environment, and robust reinvestment for the **diverse people** of the surrounding communities to live, conduct business, and play together.

OUR VALUES:

- **Diversity and Representation**

- The neighborhood's cultural diversity is its greatest strength. The Alliance will be an organization of leaders representative of our diverse community.

- **Non-Displacement**

- The Alliance's effort will be aimed at improving conditions for existing residents and businesses, and must not result in loss of affordability and gentrification.

- **Strengths-Based Approach**

- Rice & Larpenteur has many positive qualities and assets. All efforts by the Alliance will build upon and celebrate neighborhood strengths.



We are an innovative public-private partnership of three cities, one county, business, community organizations, and neighbors working to realize a shared vision for the future of a historically underserved community where three cities meet.

A Decade in the Making

OUR MISSION: To build a culturally and economically robust Rice and Larpenteur gateway area by fostering renewed public and private-sector investment centered on and responsive to the needs of the diverse residents and businesses.

The community-based Rice & Larpenteur Alliance launches with a ~50-member Advisory Board.

George Floyd is murdered and the aftermath impacts local business and community safety.

Nia Black is murdered – community demands accountability for Lamplighter Lounge.

2025

RLA launches an independent Membership Program & Board of Directors.

Sees record attendance at community events and volunteer engagement.

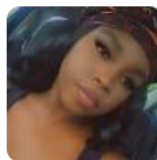

The Lamplighter Lounge closed permanently in 2022 amid sustained neighborhood advocacy.

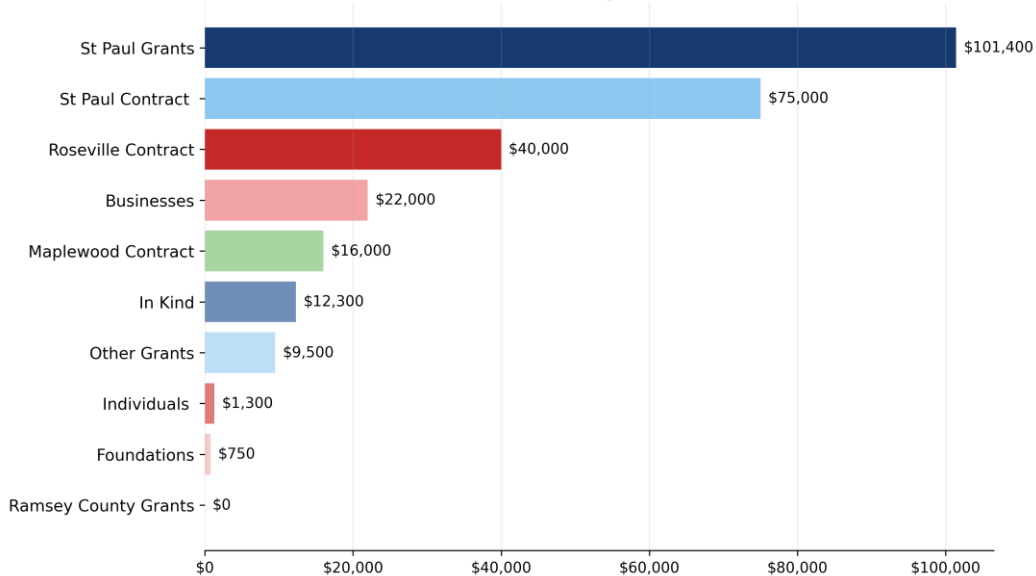


HOW IT'S FUNDED

A Public - Private Partnership

The Rice & Larpenteur Alliance is funded primarily through a contract with the Cities of Maplewood, Roseville, and Saint Paul — supplemented by Ramsey County partnership and philanthropic support, and staffed through fiscal sponsorship with the Saint Paul Area Chamber of Commerce. Over time, the RLA has increased its private donor base.

HOW ITS FUNDED

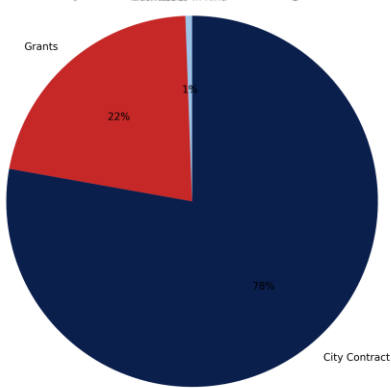
Public Dollars, Multiplied

The municipal contract is the foundation and catalyst of RLA’s budget — leveraged year after year with county and foundation grants, and a growing base of corporate and individual giving.

2019 - 77% of RLA funding was from the city contract.

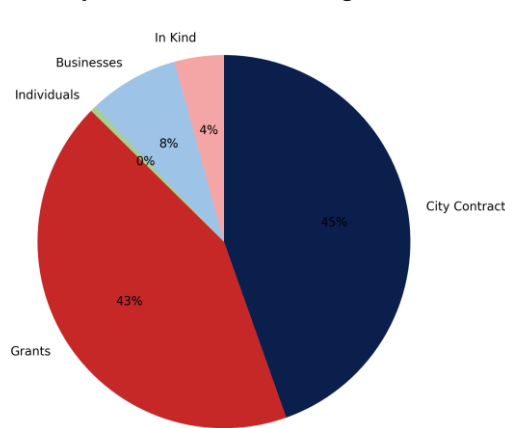
2025 - 44% of RLA funding is from the city investment.

2020

2024

RLA adopts a Board Operations Manual, DEI Statement, and Land Acknowledgment.

2025

RLA launches an independent Membership Program and 23-member Board of Directors — charting a path to long-term, community-led sustainability.

RLA will apply for a 501C3 nonprofit status. Consider boundary expansion and other earned income opportunities.

LOOKING AHEAD

The Work Ahead

- Support redevelopment of key opportunity sites and vacant or underutilized property – engage local owners and developers for **additional affordable housing**, neighborhood **amenities**, and **business growth** opportunities.
- Provide **marketing support and technical assistance to small businesses** – connecting with community resources, grants, and loans to grow on Rice Street.
- Advocate for **Rice Street redesign**, planned **transit expansion** and station area planning, and support the community through reconstruction to County Road B. Enhance the pedestrian environment and streetscape. **Ensure non-displacement of existing neighbors and businesses.**
- Encourage public investment in **parks and green space** – Lake McCarrons County Park and Rice – Arlington Regional Athletic Complex
- Sustain community events & business support amid growing community need. Build a resilient and connected community.
- Connect underserved communities to jobs, training, education, youth development, and **move from surviving to thriving.**
