2025 Needs Assessment

Libraries are not just nice to have; they are essential.

- \$9.2M gap in public funding for Transforming Libraries.
- Library's safety model is supported by City's America Rescue Plan Act funds. Will need a sustainable funding source by end of 2025.
- Flat funding for collections does not keep pace with escalating costs.
- Equitable wages, especially in lower-paying, front-facing roles increase department expenditures without equivalent increases to budget.
- Evolving role of public libraries is necessary and expensive. On our spaces and our people.
